OVERVIEW OF THE LORD'S PRAYER

BY DOUG STRINGER

After Born to Die was already being published, God gave me a revelation that in the Lord's prayer (Matthew 6:9-15), Jesus was teaching us how to be "living sacrifices" by using each of the five Levitical sacrifices! As you continue through this book and examine each sacrifice in the light of God's love, I encourage you to meditate upon them in light of this prayer, as well:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

This is the <u>Burnt Offering: Total and Holy Surrender to the Father's Will</u>. Jesus is teaching us to say, "Not my will but Yours be done."

Give us this day our daily bread...

This is <u>The Grain Offering: Jesus' Sinless Service</u>, representing our commitment to the covenant through communion.

And forgive us our debts [trespasses] as we forgive our debtors...

This is <u>The Trespass Offering: Payment for the Damages of Our Sins.</u> As the old song says, "We owed a debt we could not pay, He paid a debt He did not owe."

And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

This is The Sin Offering: Purging the Guilt of Our Sins.

By being the guilt-bearer of our sins, Jesus delivered us from the evil one so we could live eternally with God in heaven!

For Thine is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
This is The Peace Offering: Spontaneous Fellowship and
Worship, also called the Fellowship Offering, characterized by spontaneous worship and adoration of our Lord!

My desire is for *Born to Die* to awaken in you a deep desire to discover more and more of these hidden treasures of the Scripture, as you fall more deeply in love with the Savior!

•	Read Ephesians 3:20 and ask the Father to reveal to you the "extravagant blessings" He has for

•	What is the purpose of studying the Bible?
•	What were the five Levitical sacrifices that Jesus fulfilled?
•	What is the first step in the discipleship process? Which sacrifice does this relate to?

Oh, Lord, give me a clean heart, a right spirit, and a renewed mind. Show me, lead me, and teach me Your ways."
